Orders are usually sent by First Class to minimise how long they spend in the postal system and reduce the chance of them going astray. Large orders are sent 'Tracked' or 'Signed' (£3.50+). We use Special Delivery (£7.75+) for very large orders so that they are fully insured, otherwise Royal Mail pays no compensation for losses in transit.
